DECEMBER MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Our Annual Potluck Dinner was held at 6:00 p.m. with the usual fantastic array of great foods. Following the dinner, our President, Sonny LaSalle, entertained us with a wonderful slide show of his and Judy's (and 60 Sicilian relatives) trip to Sicily in April. Great program. Thanks, Sonny.

Sonny then called the meeting to order about 7:30 pm. There were approximately 60 people in attendance.

Treasurer's Report: Savings, \$3,064.78; Checking, \$3,404.53. All except three sponsors have paid for their ads.

Elections: This was Sonny's last meeting. He announced that Jeane Lippert has agreed to continue for another term as treasurer and that George Corn had been nominated for President and he had accepted the nomination. Trail Report: Gordon reported that last week there was less than 10", but that it had snowed Wednesday and Thursday and they would groom on Friday.

As for the Cabin: Gordon asked that hosts do just a minimum of shoveling between the cabin and toilet to avoid developing the deep trench we had last year. The groomers will pack the area with the machines. It may be necessary from time to time to fill in a trench. Also, he asked the Club members to just check in on the Hosts to see if they need any help since many may not be familiar with how different things work. There will be a "white" board put up in the cabin saying "Host for today is" so the names can be readily found.

Membership: Jack Losensky reported that there are currently 269 paid members, still down from last year.

He will be meeting early next year with a contingent from the Salmon, Idaho area to encourage them to get involved with the Club. Jack also reported that the dues barely cover the cost of the mailed newsletter and not only suggested that those getting the hard copy try to get it electronically, but also we may need to consider charging more for memberships to cover these costs.

Extravaganza: Linda Stout reported that the Extravaganza will be March 3rd. She had tickets for sale and was also looking for volunteers to help her.

Thanks, Sonny!! George Corn and Mel Mooers, as well as others, thanked Sonny for his three terms as president. Mel presented him with a cap with the Club logo and "Our Leader" as well as a "Hot Shower" unit for campers and rafters. We hope you enjoy it in all the free time you now have, Sonny.
