

#### Club Business

Highlights of the January 12, 2017 Ski Club Board Meeting and General Meeting

Grant: Michael Hoyt reported that the RTP grant deadline had been shortened to February 1, 2017 and that he would need Board approval to write the grant for next year. A unanimous vote was given to him to proceed with the grant writing.

Finances: Reine Hilton stated that the books were up to date but suggested they be audited. Michael Hoyt volunteered to complete this process. She stated that even though membership was somewhat lower than last year the finances were \$900 greater. The increased income has come from donations. Major expenses such as the grooming have been accounted for. Further, she stated that the 501C3 forms for state and federal taxes has been completed. Two additional items of interest included the following: The first involved the cross-country skiing loops at the Hamilton fairgrounds that have a donation box to assist with grooming by the Bitterroot Cross Country Ski Club. The second item involved the Gibbon Cross-Country Ski Trail, which does not have a donation box but may become a possibility at a future date. Board members suggested that a sign in box at the Gibbons trailhead could be made more visible by a small change in location adjacent to the trail. After balancing membership dues, donations, and other sources of income against contracted grooming and other expenses, the Club has \$31,000 in checking & savings.

School Lesson Programs: Richard Stone said that volunteers would begin the program to teach school children. He added that cross-country ski trails at Chief Joseph have some newer and wider trails to accommodate wider skis, snowshoes, and the 1-2% of skate skiers. He requested having double tracks on these trails and that information about these "wide lanes" be explained in the newsletter.

Membership: Membership chairperson Earl Phillips stated that current membership was 212 members. Last year's total membership was 251 members. New memberships continue to come in as the year progresses. He requested that if members have a change in their email address that they let him know. His contact information is in the newsletter and on the website.

President Norman Singley mentioned that he would be meeting with Scott Grasser of Lost Trail Ski Resort to discuss mutual goals in skiing programs.

Anne Creighton addressed grooming. She mentioned that the Hamilton fairgrounds had two loops, parking and restroom facilities. She also stated that the grooming was going well and that she was also open to feedback regarding trail grooming.
