





Nov 9th Program Presentation: Hiking the Mt Saint Helens' Loowit Trail

Mark Wetherington shared his experience hiking the Selway Trail with us last spring, and will return for our November meeting.

The Loowit Trail, which encircles Mount Saint Helens, is a hike unlike any other in North America. From old-growth forest to the devastated volcanic blast zone, this trek provides hikers with unforgettable scenery and an up-close look at a landscape recovering from a recent volcanic eruption.

It is not a huge time commitment – just involves contacting potential presenters and coordinating with them. We have several great presenters already lined up for the year, but can always use more.

In addition, our current Vice-President, Kelly Zeiler is stepping down this fall, and we need a volunteer to take over this role. Primary responsibilities are to attend board meetings (once a month), run member meetings in the event that I am unavailable, and generally to assist in the leadership functions of the club as needed. We thank Kelly for his generous service to the club and wish him well. Please reach out if you can step into this crucial role for the club.

I have been in touch with the new leadership of the Forest Service in Wisdom and look forward to working with them to facilitate effective management of the XC ski area.

As always I remind all skiers to sign in every time you use the trails, as complete records of user days are crucial in securing grants to help pay for grooming. Off to a Great Start

The National Weather Service's predictions as of Friday, Nov 3rd sound pretty sweet for some early season skiing:

Friday Night: Snow accumulation of 3-7 inches possible

Saturday: Snow likely, with new accumulation of 1-3 inches possible

Saturday Night: A chance of snow before midnight with accumulation of <1 inch possible.

Sunday: 50% chance of snow, with new snow accumulation of <1" possible.

Sunday Night: 80% chance of precip; new snow accumulation of 2-4 inches possible.

Monday: Snow likely, with new accumulation of 1-3 inches possible
